#### PRESIDENTS REPORT

To all my fellow track and field athletes who love the blue, black and white kit. I salute you and welcome you to this year's AGM.

And, boy what a year it was.

My first as President and the initiation process for the first three months was compelling. No wait, it was disturbing... ok, scrap that it was provocative - that will do.

But, with support from most of the Board the ship was righted and we sailed on successfully through unchartered waters.

Firstly, with the track at Sylvania Waters. So many things needed fixing, beautifying etc, et al. Many were taken care of and I'm proud to say it was us who shamed Council into fixing the showers in the girl's toilets and finally putting doors on the cubicles.

Next, the canteen came under fire at a few General Meetings but despite it not being unanimous, we kept it on predicting the future would turn.

And it has.

The canteen over the past three months has been an astonishing success story for us, with one day yielding \$4300 (previous best last year \$2100) in turn over.

Tracey Glanville in particular and Rhonda Galloway have done superbly.

That leads us to the new race days we created and I am over-the-moon with the response not just from the Board but our racing members too.

The Great Southern Mile was introduced to the racing calendar and it was a runaway success.

Maybe not in the quantity of runners first time around but certainly the quality was there.

Cam Myers won the junior men and went on to become the second fastest teenager in history over a mile, two-time Olympian Zoe Buckman won the women's, Riley McGowan won the open men's then later won the national 800m title and of course, our own budding superstar Ivy Boothroyd won the junior girl's. Since then she has been picked up by Nike and is recognised as the fastest teen for 800m in Australian history.

So, we did good with that race and it will grow.

As will our 'mini' Stawell Gift carnival, the Elzy Wellings Pro Meet. Great response and plenty of good racing. The introduction of Australia's FIRST official 40m dash was a tremendous drawcard.

Hoping to get more prizemoney for both events next term.

Of course, Dave Scott will touch on our NSW relay weekend success which we won more races than any other club.

I wanted a sea of blue and in large part got it during the year and when we introduce a new "Incentive Scheme' this year for all our athletes to aspire to, it also will be massively well received.

I make no secret of the fact I want this to become the premier High-Performance Track and Field club in the nation.

And we are on our way!

#### **Treasurer's Report**

#### 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023 – 2022/23 Season

#### Presented at AGM 28/5/2023

The 2022/23 Season saw a gradual return back to normality after previous seasons heavily affected by the COVID pandemic, with Athletes returning to a full timetable of events and our School carnivals running at near-full capacity across the season.

School carnival income doubled from the previous season, with the proceeds from running School carnivals across the season amounting to gross receipts of \$25,640. After the cost of paying our groundsmen/cleaning fees of \$9,104, the Club were left with net proceeds of \$16,536. The success of this venture was able to support our Incentive Scheme which paid a total of \$12,120 across the season to eligible athletes who represented our Club, our state and our country across that period. These funds also contribute to the cost of paying for entry/registration fees for various events for our Athletes across the system.

Our canteen also ran across the season, supporting the School carnivals held at the grounds. The canteen took in gross takings of \$82,417 for the season. The costs associated with the canteen include the cost of stock and the wages and superannuation for our canteen staff. These costs were \$81,389 for the season, which means the canteen's net profit was \$1,028. The future of the canteen has been discussed at length across the season. Discussion points taken into consideration include the low profit margins (related to the increasing cost of stock), increasing costs of wages and superannuation and the volume of volunteer time required to support the administration of running the canteen. It was agreed that the canteen would continue for the 2023/24 season, as it was viewed as a valuable attraction for the School carnivals, with various measures in place to reduce the administrative burden of the day to day running, as well as a focus on ensuring the canteen proceeds can cover the associated costs. I suggest that the canteen operations be reviewed on an annual basis to ensure that this is continues to be a financially feasible exercise for our Club.

2022/23 season saw the first Tradies Great Southern Mile event. This event was heavily sponsored by corporate sponsors. SDAC kicked in a total of \$1,115 to support this event.

It was decided by Committee that the value being carried for the old Sutherland uniform stock we written off, due to the introduction of the new uniform supplier. It was also agreed to write off the balance of the Timing Tags. Both write-off values are shown in the profit & loss report for the year, which contributes to the net loss for the year. The depreciation of the equipment is also a non-cash expense that is purely acknowledgement of the depreciating value of the equipment bought over the years.

It is my hope that the Club can secure some ongoing sponsorship across the coming seasons which will help cover the other costs associated with running the Club. Otherwise registration fees may need to be examined, or decisions about the ongoing activities of the Club across the season may need to be reviewed to ensure that we are covering our costs, and not eating into funds held by the Club.

Thanks goes to Dave Scott for his support in this role across the year and sharing the workload. Thanks also to Tracey Glanville for her support with the canteen operations and Rhona Galloway for her support with the School carnival operations.

I wish the Club success for the 2023/24 and future seasons. I will remain a parent in the Club, but will not be continuing as Treasurer.

#### Winter Cross Country Chairperson's Report

After two interrupted years through the pandemic, the 2022 winter cross country planning commenced with a real sense of positivity. A complete calendar of events was published with the first run located at Solander Fields during the first week of April which meant a slightly later start to the season compared to prior years. This was intentionally done, the national and state summer athletics program was extended due to COVID and hence it made sense to align the start accordingly.

The year presented a unique set of challenges mainly caused by rainfall and endless storms. This meant that most courses set in the calendar of events would need to be evaluated by the committee on a week to week basis with closures set by the national parks and our own safety concerns for members always front of mind. As a consequence there were several changes to the calendar where our best plans had to change and paved courses used more than intended.

The weather unfortunately also forced the cancellation of the 2022 Sutherland Half Marathon. The committee attempted various alternatives to try and hold the event but in the end (and with consultation from National Parks) the state of Lady Carrington Drive and the extra logistics required to move equipment would lead to only one possible conclusion.

On a positive, club participation levels at Saturday afternoon events during the season averaged between 45-60 runners. Whilst these averages are below 2019 cross country numbers, a dip in participation was anticipated given the impact of the pandemic and (at that point in time) a higher level of caution displayed in the community to return to prelockdown ways.

Sutherland District Athletics club successfully defended and retained the Endeavour Cup which was run at Scarborough Park in July 2022.

The club was well represented early in the season at NSW Novices/St George Classic and the Sydney 10 held at Sydney Olympic Park. This carried through the entire season with Sutherland District Athletics club colours were proudly worn at every key race. Particular mention and congratulations to the following athletes in 2022:














### Winter Race Walking 2022/2023

Sutherland District Athletics Club have always hosted an Open Day for the New South Wales Race Walking Club so it was finally great to see this take place once again after the last two years of cancellations due to COVID-19. It was an extremely well attended competition that took place at Moore Reserve, Oatley on the 13th August. Sutherland Club Secretary, Terry Ross, was there to present the awards.







### **Our Race Walking Judges**

Sutherland has two World Athletics graded Walk Judges, Heather Mitchell and Kirsten Crocker, who are qualified to officiate in all events but who are among the most highly graded walk judges in Australia. This year they have both officiated at State Championships, Australian Open Championships, the Sydney Track Classic as well as at numerous local carnivals, competitions, and championships throughout the summer and winter season.

This season has been one of our most rewarding times, as it was an extreme pleasure to see in the Queen's Birthday 2022 Honours List, that **Heather Mitchell** was to receive an **Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for service to Athletics**. It is no small feat of what Heather has accomplished in managing, organising, officiating and educating people in the area of athletics since 1977. Congratulations Heather.



2022 then took off for Kirsten as she was one of only five Australian Officials to be selected to officiate at the World Athletics Championships in Oregon, USA in July. There was then a quick turnaround for Kirsten as she was also selected to officiate as an International

Race Walking Judge at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games, UK. Athletics Victoria asked her to give a Zoom Seminar to Athletics officials about the Call Room, which was attended by 73 Victorian and interstate officials and which is now available on Athletics Victoria's website. The year then concluded with Kirsten becoming one of five finalists in the 2022 Sport NSW - Official of the Year Awards.

Finally 2023 started off extremely well when Kirsten was selected to be the Referee of the Call Room at the World Cross Country Championships in Bathurst. It was the first time that a World Athletics event had been held in the Southern Hemisphere and it was a massive success.

#### Sutherland DAC

Membership - Registrar's Report 2022/2023 season

During the current 2022/2023 season (1<sup>st</sup> sept 2022 through to May 15<sup>th</sup> 2023 thus far) 268 people have chosen to register with Sutherland DAC. This was a 5% decrease on the numbers from the same time frame as the prior year, and is substantially lower (about 30%) than pre-covid numbers. There has, however, been some substantial redistribution amongst membership types this year. Dual athletes (those associated with LANSW) have decreased slightly and community members (who participate only in club events) have also dropped off significantly. This has been compensated somewhat by a substantial increase in ANSW female concession (U19) membership.
